



◀ Jane Addams, born on September 6, 1860, dedicated herself to helping poor immigrants who arrived in Chicago in the late 1800s. She opened Hull House to provide immigrants with educational programs, assistance in finding jobs and housing, and help with their **physical** and emotional needs. Addams died in 1935. She is known as one of America’s pioneering social workers.
