



◀ During the Great Depression of the 1930s, the average annual **income** for an American family was \$1,160. That meant families had about \$97 a month to pay for all of their expenses. Women came up with innovative ways to make money go as far as possible. Many learned how to make their own clothes and grow their own food.
