



◀ Jeannette Rankin, born on June 11, 1880 in Missoula, Montana, was the first woman elected to Congress. She was a pacifist, someone who is against any kind of violence. From her **perspective**, war was wrong. After the Japanese bombed Pearl Harbor in December 1941, she was the only person in Congress to vote against declaring war on Japan. She died in 1973.
